TOS and IOC, in observance of the International Year of the Ocean and the TOS 10th anniversary, announce their first jointly sponsored meeting, which will explore the theme “Coastal and Marginal Seas.” With a strong multidisciplinary scientific program, a format that encourages interaction, social events and the choice of Paris, with its unique charm, history and attractions, as the site—TOS and IOC offer a valuable, informative and enjoyable meeting. Plan now to join your colleagues in Paris at one of the major oceanographic meetings of 1998.

MEETING FORMAT

The meeting format will feature daily morning plenary sessions of invited talks followed by afternoons devoted to contributed posters focusing on (but not limited to) the day’s themes. Commercial and educational exhibits will be co-located with the contributed posters. One, possibly two, evening receptions, daily morning and afternoon coffee breaks are included in the registration fee and are an integral part of the TOS interactive format. Students are invited to attend and participate. Fifty students will be permitted to register at half the applicable regular registration fee. The half-price student registrations will be allocated on a first-come basis, with preference given to students submitting abstracts and presenting posters.

Some financial support will be available from SCOR for oceanographers from developing countries; applications for this support must be received at TOS headquarters by *February 1, 1998*.

CALL FOR POSTER ABSTRACTS General Information

Poster abstracts will be accepted for review *November 1–March 15, 1998*. Abstract titles and content need *not* be specific to one of the broad session themes as indicated in the program. Poster abstracts relating to the theme of a given day will be presented on that day. Poster abstracts not specific to any of the themes will be presented on the day assigned them by the Abstract Manager, but every attempt will be made to assign posters for presentation on the day preferred by the author(s). TOS, however, must reserve the right to make the final assignments in order to balance the number of posters over the course of the meeting. All participants, including poster presenters, must register for the meeting.

Submitted abstracts relating to one of the daily themes or subthemes will be reviewed by the appropriate Session Chair or by the Program Chair for titles outside session themes and subthemes. The Chairs will determine which abstracts are accepted for poster presentation and inclusion in the abstract volume. Abstract acceptance notices will be issued no later than *April 15, 1998*. Every effort will be made to issue early abstract acceptances to those who submit abstracts early. If your attendance at the meeting is predicated upon acceptance of your abstract, it is to your advantage to submit your abstract early or, if your abstract is submitted close to the deadline, make provisional lodging and travel arrangements.

Abstract Format

Abstracts are limited to 250 words, including title and author(s) information (name[s], affiliation[s], and address[es]). An e-mail address for the first author is

requested. Overly long abstracts will be returned to the author for editing.

Abstract Submissions

Electronic mail is the preferred method for submitting abstracts and will ensure the quickest acceptance notification. Abstracts may also be submitted via FAX, mail or other delivery service for an additional charge (see below).

E-mail and FAX Submissions

Abstract Fees

The abstract fee is **US\$60** (US\$30 for students) for abstracts submitted via e-mail or **US\$75** (US\$36) for those submitted by any other means. The fee covers the cost of poster boards as well as processing and publication of abstracts in the abstract volume that is distributed during and after the meeting. Payment must be made at the time the abstract is submitted and can be made with check or money order payable to "The Oceanography Society" (in U.S. funds, drawn on a U.S. bank) or credit card (Mastercard/Eurocard or Visa only). Abstracts submitted via electronic mail must be paid with a credit card for which the account number and expiration date are provided when the abstract is transmitted. We regret that we are unable to process training or purchase orders and cannot issue invoices for payment. Fees for abstracts that are not accepted will be refunded. Revisions to abstracts are discouraged; revised abstracts must be treated as new submissions and the applicable abstract fee will be charged again.

Poster Supports

TOS will provide each presenter with a poster frame on which foam core board is hung. The foam core display area will be 1.5m (59 in.) wide by 2m (79 in.) high. Posters can be mounted on the foam core board with push pins, tacks or velcro dots (to be provided by poster presenter).

Abstract Publication

The meeting program and abstracts will be published in an issue of the TOS publication, *Oceanography*, and abstracts may be cited as published in *Oceanography* after the meeting.

REGISTRATION

All participants, including poster presenters, must register for the meeting. To register for the meeting, complete the attached registration form. Mail or fax it with appropriate payment or credit card information to our official registration contractor: **E. H. Pechan & Associates** (address shown below). You will receive confirmation of registration and subsequent meeting details from Pechan & Associates.

The deadline for receipt by Pechan & Associates of advance registration is **May 9, 1998**. Registration after that deadline must be done on-site with a 20% surcharge. We regret we are unable to process training or purchase orders and cannot issue invoices for payment. Notification of cancellations must be received in writing by Pechan & Associates no later than **May 9, 1998**. Refunds are subject to a \$25 cancellation fee. Receipts for the registration fee will be printed on the back of meeting badges which will be distributed at the meeting.

The registration fee covers attendance at all scientific and social functions, including, coffee and soft drink breaks during the plenary and poster/exhibit sessions, and a reception hosted by IOC, TOS and the U.S. Office of Naval Research, International Field Office, Europe (ONRIFO) on Tuesday June 2, at UNESCO headquarters. The possibility of additional evening receptions is being explored at this writing. Each registrant will receive his/her badge and a volume containing the final Meeting Program, Abstracts and Exhibits Directory at the meeting.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS

June is normally a very busy period for Paris hotels and will be even more so in June 1998 due to World Cup games being played in Paris and around France over the meeting dates. Arrangements have been made, however, with **A.T.I. Congrès & Salons** whereby rooms in various 2-, 3-, and 4-star hotels around the city are blocked for the TOS-IOC meeting participants. The deadline for reservations within the TOS room block is **May 20, 1998**. Hotel reservations are to be made by the attendee directly with A.T.I. The enclosed Hotel Booking Form is provided for your

convenience but if you choose to telephone, be certain to identify yourself as a TOS-IOC meeting participant in order to be included in this special room block. Reservations made after the deadline date are subject to availability and, if available, will be at the regular (higher) commercial rates. All reservations must be prepaid in full. Cancellations must be handled through A.T.I., not with the hotel directly.

Hotels in the TOS-IOC room block are located in concentric circles around UNESCO headquarters (Eiffel Tower area). Rooms will be assigned by A.T.I. on a first-come-first-served within the price range and area(s) specified. The earlier your reservation is made, the closer you are likely to be to UNESCO. While it will be impossible to house all meeting attendees within walking distance of UNESCO, the Paris Metro provides an efficient, inexpensive means for getting around the city. Your hotel confirmation from A.T.I. will include a map of Paris, a Metro map and the name of the nearest Metro station which will enable you to plan your travel between your hotel and UNESCO. **We urge you to make reservations early** to ensure accommodations in the area and price range you desire.
