To be considered an applicant for the fellowship program, students must meet the following criteria:

- Be a US Citizen.
- Have a cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.30 or better.
- Possess, or be in the process of completing, an undergraduate degree in Engineering by May 2013.
- Commit to a minimum of one year employment in the homeland security workforce post graduation.
- Formally admitted, or in the process of applying, into the Stevens Master's degree program in Maritime Systems.

Women and students from underrepresented communities are encouraged to apply.
